

REMEMBERING OUR FALLEN FIRE FIGHTERS

The morning of September 11, 2001 is still very fresh on my mind, however, I am different than most. It seems to me that a lot of folks have put it aside in their memory bank and not for safe keeping but in hopes of forgetting all about that horrible day. So here is a news flash for those I just mentioned. The memory of what happened the morning of September 11, 2001 isn't going away any time soon, I promise.

Unless you were a small child or in a coma, you remember exactly what you were doing the second you found out that a commercial airliner struck one of the World Trade Center's 110 story towers. If you are my age, you remember exactly what you were doing when the announcement that President John Fitzgerald Kennedy was assassinated. For me I was in the 7th grade third period Mr. Powell's English class. And as well you will remember what you were doing at the exact moment that you received the news of the Discovery disaster, with me, I was getting beat at ping pong by Tommy Erickecon at Fire Station # 28. The memory of all of these events will stay with us forever as will the memory of the terrible day in September.

A few days ago while writing this article I received an email from Chief Billy Goldfedder's "Secret List" reporting that there were several maydays broadcasted from a fire in a high rise building next to "Ground Zero." A few hours later he sent another email reporting that FDNY lost two Fire Fighters at the Deutsche Bank building. This building was severely damaged in the attack of the World Trade Center. The building has been draped in a large black net and was awaiting demolition. Environmental disputes, contactor disputes and a continued search of the building for human remains has slowed down the process. Here is what he had to say.

As Fire Fighters everywhere, especially in NYC grieve the horrific Line-of-Duty Deaths of FDNY Fire Fighters Joseph Graffagnino and Robert Beddia from E-24/L-5 yesterday, it is hard to not see the terrorist murders of 9/11 again extending to the loss of these two Fire Fighters. Fire Fighter Beddia, 53, had been a Fire Fighter for 23 years; Fire Fighter Graffagnino, 33, had been with the FDNY for eight years... both were trapped and ran out of air.

The building is a "war torn" reminder that the USA was attacked on 9/11/01.... and then yesterday, two more FDNY Fire Fighter were killed... in a fire that would not have happened if 9/11 had never happened. But it did - and they died yesterday. Actually, many have died since 9/11, due to 9/11. There are many other Fire Fighters, EMS and Cops who have died due to attack related illnesses, since 9/11. Sadly, the Country doesn't really always seem to realize it... or at least act like it. But yesterday, two more FDNY Fire Fighters, Beddia and Graffagnino, were killed, related to 9/11, adding two more to the numbers.


COMPLICATIONS: While understanding the 9/11 connection, other questions are coming out related to yesterdays fatal fire as well. Fire Fighters faced nasty conditions with plywood sheets

propped up against walls, areas altered, confusing access and boxes of equipment and crap all around. Because the building was under demolition, there was also the issue of asbestos with the asbestos removal going on. The building is also covered in scaffolding and black construction webbing. The building standpipes were not usable as code requires and all lines had to be manually stretchedadding to the complications. Fire Fighter's Graffagnino and Beddia were found on the 14th and 15th floors.

FAMILY: And then there is the nightmare that the loved ones go through... as, for example, another Grandma lost another Grandson. "It's so awful, I don't know what to do. My whole family is distraught," Graffagnino's tearful Grandma Connie Marchisotto, 90, told media. "This is horrible." The grieving grandma said she feared the worst when she saw the fire on TV. "I turned on the news to check on the weather and I saw this breaking news," Marchisotto said. "He was my grandson, so many good memories." The eight-year FDNY vet would have turned 34 this week. FF Beddia, 53, was 23-year FDNY vet and Staten Island resident.

HISTORY: Fire Fighter Graffagnino and Beddia's firehouse is sadly, no stranger to LODD's....they lost 11 Fire Fighters on 9/11. You should also remember that Engine 24 and Ladder 5 was the home of the late Captain John Drennan, Fire Fighter's James Young, 31, and Christopher Siedenburg, 25, who were killed in that fire at 62 Watts Street in Manhattan on March 28, 1994. What I remember most is hearing what Captain Drennan went through....that he lived for 40 days with 4th degree burns over most of his body. His wife Vina, to this day is on a mission related to Fire Fighter survival and she serves on the Board of Directors of the NFFF.

Our sympathies go out to all effected, especially the members of E-24 and L-5...but especially the families of Fire Fighter Graffagnino & Fire Fighter Beddia.
